Response papers (2x a week) and final paper made this class very manageable and kept me engaged in the class without burying me under piles of work.

The response papers were a great way to force students to keep up with the online content as well as the shorter duration of a summer session. Using responses in this way helps to apply the concepts in the class rather than memorizing information for exams. Further, if you do not understand the material it will be addressed immediately rather than halfway through the session during a midterm.

I liked the response papers! They were an easy way to keep my grade up and make sure that I retained knowledge.

Fairness and impartiality of grading.

Getting a 9 versus a 10 seemed unclear to me. When I looked at my grades, some of the response papers that seemed closer to a 10 received a 9 and vice versa. It's small but something I wasn't able to distinguish.

When there isn't a strict rubric on the papers, and not a clear explanation for why we received less than 100%, it is hard to understand how to improve.

I felt frustrated that, although understandable, I did not receive grades back until several assignments had been submitted. Since there were two TA's grading the papers, I could not gauge how to respond in a way that would consistently promote an A paper.

I asked a TA if there were strategies to improve my grade, but they could not think of any objective advice. In my opinion, the standards for grading were too subjective.

This could be a comment for the TAs, but I felt like it was impossible to get 10/10 on ANY of my reading responses.

Grading was fair, I wish additional feedback was given due to how the grading has a certain word counts to meet but the requirement requires student's to portray a response of a 'thought-provoking way' while taking a note of 'word count causes a limit.
