### 2023 Fall General Course Evaluations

# 1 - 1. How would you describe your level of engagement in this course? How did you engage in class? For example: Did you come to class prepared? Did you seek help from the instructor, peers, or other supports when needed?

**Response Rate** 18/24 (75%)

- I was very engaged in this course. I really enjoyed doing the readings and setting questions aside to discuss with Professor Hale. I also found myself talking about the subject matter in my other classes as well, and with my friends outside of class. I was probably a little insufferable but this class was great.
- I feel I was decently engaged throughout the course by asking questions in class, going into office hours with questions about homework, and spending a great deal of time per week working on the homework worksheets.
- I answered questions regularly and tried to ask my own when I thought they'd add to the conversation.
- · I came to class prepared, asked questions, and completed all assignments on time.
- · My level of engagement with this course was high. I always came to class prepared and completed all readings and assignments on time.
- I was pretty engaged, I definitely didn't do every reading but the lectures were super interesting and engaging so I was certainly focused there
- I engaged with this course by coming to class everyday on time and completing the readings. I never felt the need to come to office hours, but I knew that, if I needed it, Prof. Hale was there to help.
- · My level of engagement in this course was high since the class was comfortable and office hours was welcoming.
- I engaged in this class by coming to class having the readings done, asking lots of questions to clarify material, and answering Professor Hale's questions. I completed every worksheet on time. On numerous occasions, I went to office hours to seek help on the worksheet, advice on the essay, or general major advising.
- As always with Professor Hale's courses, the level of engagement is fantastic. He frequently is a good professor: First, he understands that attendance is not always necessary for every single class and that we don't have to tell him about being absent unless it would be a lot of time. Second, he always makes many jokes in every presentation and is fun to learn from. Third, he is an excellent explainer of the content. He should teach this class again and ones similar to it.
- I came to class prepared, and the class structure was very much conducive to engegement.
- I believe I was very engaged in this course. I did all of the readings and was always prepared for class. I participated in class discussions most days and actively listened/ took notes. I attended office hours several times.

#### 2 - 2. How did this course influence, change, or help shape your understanding of the subject matter?

Response Rate 17/24 (70.83%)

- This is the first comparative politics class I've taken at oxy, and it really opened my eyes to how important it is to study governments around the world. I will be taking comparative politics in the spring and am looking forward to continuing to explore in that regard. I had also never thought about reform to the actual way we elect people in the US, which I now cannot seem to stop thinking about.
- I have a more in depth understanding and appreciation for the intricacies of electoral systems. This is an entire aspect of political science that is often undiscussed and under appreciated, and I'm glad to have the context for what all the acronyms mean now!
- This course has been fundamental in expanding my understanding of elections in different countries and how not every system is the same as the US.
- I understood electoral politics so much better and now can contribute some issues to our electoral system, which i was very confused by before.

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#### 3 - 3. What skills or capacities did you expect to gain from this course? How and to what extent did the course help you to develop those skills or capacities?

Response Rate 18/24 (75%

- · Ability to analyze the actual processes by which votes are turned into seats. This class certainly met that goal / expectation.
- Understanding how to allocate votes using different electoral systems, and when I read political journals, articles, and books, I actually somewhat understand what electoral experts are talking about.
- I did not expect to learn new math but that was fun and possibly helpful in the future!
- The worksheets helped me understand the material and Hale was very engaged with all of our questions, no matter how stupid.
- I expected to learn more about electoral systems and elections. This course taught me exactly this, I even learned about a wider variety of electoral systems than I even knew existed.
- Analyze and understand electoral systems, I doubt there is an electoral system in the world that I couldn't do that for now. It taught me so much.
- I expected to gain knowledge of the electoral systems used around the world and I did! I also learned how to predict the number of parties a legislature might have with math and formulas, which I wasn't expecting!
- I learned how to calculate expected and observed vote/seat winning parties in a given election and I understand all popular electoral systems used around the world today.
- Besides literacy and understanding of the various electoral systems, I learned the various calculations about calculating expected/observed seat/vote/disproportionality values.
- It helped me develop the skill of what electoral reform to propose in real life when I work in government some day.
- I learned to look deeper into the power structures at play when analyzing the efficacy of a political system. Mad at the two party system? Don't be mad at voters, or even politicians themselves. Look at the electoral system and how it forces voters and legislators to act accordingly.
- I did not know what to expect going into this course. Coming out of this course, my knowledge has greatly increased. I understand how to calculate expected and observed seat and course values and have a deep understanding of many different electoral system. This course helped me develop math skills with all of the calculations we did as well as reasoning skills.
- I expected to be able to understand international elections and how electoral systems actually function apart from the United States' elections. The course gave me an extensive knowledge of the most notable and common practices of electoral systems as well as the functioning of electoral reform.
- I expected to learn about all of the major electoral systems and ways to judge them and I got just that.
- I learned a lot about how election experts calculate stats like disproportionality and other things
- I did not know what to expect coming into the class because it was a subject matter I didn't know much about. I gained skills in understanding elections and how systems work and impact representation which was a really applicable to my political knowledge.
- I gained skills in analyzing election results from non-US elections, an area I had no experience with in the past. I now feel comfortable engaging with these topics and now have better tools to understand foreign elections.
- I expected to learn about different electoral systems and how they influence politics. I learned this and more.

Response Rate 17/24 (70.83%)

- I came to really enjoy the worksheets, and I thought that the lectures were super informative. I learned a lot through doing, and professor hale was always available to help out with questions on the worksheets.
- Sometimes I wish we were able to have more discussions about our individual thoughts/the entire class's thoughts on the electoral systems we were analyzing. The constant lecturing could sometimes feel a little repetitive, and I found when we had class discussions about the systems towards the end of the semester, those talks were interesting and very engaging. Also, the day where we went to the bio building and listened to a talk about the Australian Vote to Parliament facilitated engaging discussions and questions from students.
- The slides were expertly balanced between examples and material, but the readings being very disconnected led to a feeling that they weren't necessary, so when they were brought into in class discussions people sometimes felt surprised.

- Prof. Hale's lectures in this course where engaging and interesting. Worksheets also offered good practice for understanding and grappling with complex formulas and systems. - Lectures in this course were effective. There was less discussion in this course than I expected, but it is understandable given our unfamiliarity with these systems. There were plenty of opportunities for students to ask questions and these also contributed to my understanding of course material.
- I think the worksheets were very effective, they helped me learn the content at a deeper level while going at an easy pace to keep up with. I will say that although the class was easy for me which was nice, I could definitely see a Mid-Term shorter paper or project being added in to help the class prepare for the final paper.

**Response Rate** 17/24 (70.83%)
